Dear Friends,

One of the joys of preparing an annual report is that it gives us a chance to look back and be thankful for all that has been accomplished. The past year was filled with both opportunities and challenges. Some highlights were:

- Provided a spring educational conference for 233 sheriffs and deputies representing 86 sheriff's offices in April 2025 in Roanoke, VA
- Awarded 65 scholarships to people throughout Virginia who are majoring in criminal justice at a Virginia college or university for a total of \$63,000.
- Provided a weekly email newsletter, the *Virginia Sheriffs Dispatch*, to sheriff and deputy members and a quarterly newsletter to VSI associate and business members
- Provided 2 lawful employment training programs for 132 sheriffs and deputies.
- Contributed to the following organizations: Virginia State Police Association, Emergency Relief Fund, Virginia Coalition for the Prevention of Elder Abuse, Inc., Concerns of Police Survivors, Inc. (COPS), Drive to Work, the Virginia Victim Assistance Network, Virginia Law Enforcement Accreditation Coalition, VALECO, Virginia Animal Control Association, and Virginia Crimes Against Children
- Provided a Virginia Law Enforcement Memorial Fund to honor Virginia officers killed in the line of duty through its Virginia license plate sales to the Frederick County Sheriff's Office, the Charles City County Sheriff's Office, and the Chesterfield County Sheriff's Office.
- Welcomed 25 new and 8 recertified VSI Certified (VSIC) sheriffs and deputies at the 2025 VSI conference.
- Held a VSI Executive Management training program on ethics for 64 Chief Deputies in October 2025.
